The only remaining tulip bulb farm has a selection of a variety of tulips that will blossom extremely early, around the same time as the cherry trees. We have also planted rape flowers, which will allow us to harvest rapeseed oil. This will result in a miraculous quartet of cherry blossom trees, tulips, and rape flowers against the snowy backdrop of Mt. Asahidake and Mt. Shiroumadake. Spring will be in full chorus to the songs of the skylarks, presenting a landscape that is nothing short of heaven on earth.

In the Birudani district,

Batabata tea has been

passed down since the Muromachi period. Fermented tea is placed in a Gorobachi bowl, and vigorously stirred using a two-pronged bamboo whisk. The name Batabata," meaning noisy commotion, is said to have come from this whisking process. Post-fermentation

tea such as this is rare in

Japan.



### Birutani washi papermaking experience

This was a former residence of the Ito family, overseeing a group of ten villages in the former Kanazawa Domain. It was restored in 1878 to prepare for the Meiji Emperor's visit, using premium cedar brought from the Hida area. Gold foil covers the entire wall of the room in which the emperor stayed. Every corner of this historical building demonstrates craftsmanship.
